# Script for Christmas and Epiphany 2013-2014

December 29, 30, 2013 and January 5, 6, 2014

# **Gathering**

6:15

Congregants are welcomed at the door by Emily.

The **Greeter** brings them inside, gets them a name tag, and hooks them into preparations for the meal.

7:00

The **Deacon** checks to be sure the tables are fully set, with bread all set out on the same table.

The **Deacon** checks in with the Community Coordinator and the Presider, then rings the bell and says,

-Come and gather around the candle!

The **Deacon** hands out copies of "What Child is This" and candles.

# The **Song Leader** begins the gathering song:

### "What Child is This"

When we've learned the song and folks are singing, **The Deacon** distributes candles

**The Song Leader** signals the end of the song. The **Song Leader** invites a drone

#### **Collect**

Christ our Lord.

Presider: Almighty God, you have

poured upon us the new light of your incarnate Word: Grant that this light, enkindled in our hearts, may shine forth in our lives; through Jesus Christ, who

lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

Leader: (spoken) Amen.

#### **Introductions**

### **The Presider** says:

- -Welcome
- -St. Lydia's is a church where we share a sacred meal just as the first followers of lesus did.
- -Introduce self, Community Coordinator, Song Leader, and Deacon
- -The Deacon will lead you through the service as we go

### **The Deacon** says:

- -We'll process to the tables now, singing a song that \_\_\_\_\_ will teach.
- -When you get there, light all the candles on the tables and then plant your candle in the trays of rice.
- -Then, find a place at a table and remain standing

# **Candle Lighting**

The **Song Leader** leads a Candle lighting song:

### The Light of Christ

shruti box on silver

The **Deacon** lights his/her candle from the Christ Candle, then passes the light to one person.

Everyone moves to the tables.

Once everyone is gathered and all candles are lit, the **Song Leader** signals end of song.

- -We stand to pray with hands lifted, as was the custom in the early church.
- -After you receive the bread, give your neighbor a piece, saying, "This is my body."

Presider: Holy food for Holy People. Share in the meal.

The **presider** gives a large piece of bread, in a napkin, to his/her neighbor on each side, saying:

"This is my body."

### **Sharing the Meal**

### The Deacon says:

-We'll spend the first part of our meal in conversation. When folks are finishing up, we'll move into scripture reading.\_\_\_\_\_\_, what are we eating?

-There's juice and water on the tables. Please sit down anywhere you like first; then send one person from your table with bowls/plates to be served.

Everyone is seated at the tables.

### **The Word**

**The Preacher** preaches informally, and invites responses.

After 3-4 responses, the **preacher** says, "Thank you all."

### The Deacon says:

-For our time of prayer, we'll take hands, and begin with a song that

The **Song Leader** ends the time of prayer by repeating the song.

# **Blessing the Cup**

### **The Deacon** says:

-We bless our cup at the end of our meal, just as Jesus did when he was at table with the disciples. Please make sure there is some grape juice in your cup.

Everyone lifts their cup.

The **Song Leader** invites a drone over the shruti box (silver) and leads the response.

# **Cleaning Up**

The Deacon gives instructions for clean up:

-we'll finish the service with dessert and a final hymn around the offering table [gesture].

-but first we'll clean up

-we'll bring dishes to sink, wash and dry them, blow out the candles, put them in the storage room, and rearrange the tables

### get volunteers:

- -2 washers
- -2 rinsers
- -2 driers
- -1 putting-away director who knows where things go in the kitchen
- -3 to put things away
- -1 laundry collectors

Everyone cleans up together.

**The Deacon** oversees things in the dining area **The Lead Cook** oversees things in the kitchen **The Song Leader** leads an Offering Song:

**The Deacon** checks the kitchen to make sure it is clean, things are put away, and the stove is off.
